The English Department at Webster values an individual relationship with each student; therefore, if at all possible, the student should complete all core requirements at Webster.

*Minimum residency requirement is 30 of the student's last 36 credits completed at Webster University.

^18 credits of departmental courses must be completed at Webster University as well as Portfolio Review (0 credits). At least 12 credits of the 24 specific emphasis courses must be taken at Webster University. No more than 6 credits of "D" grades may count toward fulfilling specific requirements of the major.

#Courses completed with a grade lower than C- will not count toward fulfilling general education requirements. Students who complete an Associate of Arts (A.A.) degree before transferring to Webster University will have completed all of their general education requirements.

**Certificate program must be completed entirely at Webster University with grades of C or better.

** Students must complete WRIT 2400 Introduction to Professional Writing as part of the certificate.

The primary focus is on learning the art of **reading as a writer**: opening up influences, gathering strategies, widening the range of what is possible in students' own writing.
