St. Louis Community College students who plan to transfer and complete the approved 42 Hour General Education Requirements will have "Missouri General Education Requirements" certification noted on their transcripts. This certification satisfies all General Education Requirements for Missouri public colleges and universities effective Fall 2003.

Graduates of St. Louis Community College who hold an Associate in Arts degree will have satisfied Webster University's General Education Requirements. Students transferring to Webster without completion of an Associate in Arts degree or the approved 42 Hour General Education certification will have their college-level coursework evaluated on a course-by-course basis for equivalency with Webster University's General Education Requirement.

General Education:

Without an Associate in Arts degree all School of Communication students must complete a minimum of 36 credits of General Education with the following distribution:

Category One: 18 credits (Art, Art History, Dance, English, General Studies, History, Foreign Language, Music, Religion, Theatre, Philosophy, Writing) English composition courses do not count.

Category Two: 12 credits (Anthropology, Economics, International Relations, International Studies, Human Rights Studies, Multicultural Studies, Political Studies, Psychology, Sociology, Women's Studies)

Category Three: 6 credits (Biology, Chemistry, Computer Applications, Computer Science, Math, Physics, Science)

Only grades of C- or better will count towards the General Education or major requirements.

Pre-Enrollment Interview

Transfer students with prior coursework in communications may submit a portfolio of their work in a pre-enrollment interview with the Department Chair to determine placement within the curriculum or their standing regarding Portfolio Review. If a student meets the portfolio review criteria, this pre-enrollment interview may serve as their Portfolio Review. **Students should save papers/projects from their communications classes at the community college for this interview.**

BA/JOURNALISM

The print journalism major prepares students for entry-level jobs on weekly and daily newspapers, as well as for magazine work and for free-lance writing assignments. Students learn all aspects of publication production, acquire word processing and desktop publishing computer skills, and write for the award-winning weekly campus newspaper, *The Journal*. Majors are required to learn all genres of newspaper writing, as well as to receive a firm grounding in journalism history, media ethics, and communications law. Many students work in internships on monthly, weekly, and daily publications before entering the journalism career field.
