The English Department at Webster values an individual relationship with each student; therefore, if at all possible, the student should complete all core requirements at Webster.

*Minimum residency requirement: 30 of the student's last 36 credits must be completed at Webster University.

^18 credits within the major must be completed at Webster University as well as Portfolio Review (0 credits). At least 12 credits of the 21 specific emphasis courses must be taken at Webster University. No more than 6 credits of "D" grades may count toward fulfilling specific requirements of the major.

#Courses completed with a grade lower than C- will not count toward fulfilling general education requirements. Students who complete an Associate of Arts (A.A.) degree before transferring to Webster University will have completed all of their general education requirements.

**Certificate program must be completed entirely at Webster University with grades of C or better.

** Students must complete WRIT 2400 Introduction to Professional Writing as part of the certificate.

Drama

Students graduating with this emphasis will have a strong foundation in dramatic literature, its primary authors, periods, and genres from the ancient Greeks to the present as well as an acquaintance with the performance culture of the theater and its critical theory. There are no courses offered at St. Louis Community College which are applicable in this category.

Literature, Society and Politics

This emphasis underscores literature's relationship to the larger world, and its ability to illustrate and explore the diversity of the human experience. Underpinning this emphasis are a commitment to individual human dignity, an awareness of the importance of mutual responsibility and community, and an emphasis on the sympathetic imagination as the foundation for ethical behavior.
